7 women to carry on the late fabricator's legacy



The late Jessi Combs was a trailblazer and a stereotype breaker driven to succeed while lifting people up, particularly women, throughout her career as a motorcyclist, racer, television personality, and master fabricator. After her untimely death in 2019, The Jessi Combs Foundation was formed and scholarships were put together. Now, just one year later, the board of directors is awarding seven women with a combined \$30,000 worth of scholarships who are pursuing careers in the trades.
